## General Information

### Admission

\$25 per vehicle for a one-time admission

\$70 per vehicle for a whole-show pass

*(regardless of number of occupants in the vehicle or vehicle size)*

Vehicle passes are available only at the fairgrounds entrance gate and cannot be purchased in advance from OQHA. Please note that whole-show vehicle windshield sticker passes are not transferable between multiple vehicles.

All horse trailers parking South of 17th Avenue will be charged the \$40 per day camping fee. Trailers that are not being used for camping will have the option to park at no charge in the trailer lot North of 17th Avenue.

There will be no additional admission charge for the show upon parking, with the exception of:

## Entries

### Entry Deadline

All Congress horse show entries must be postmarked by **August 25, 2009**, and received within three working days. It is recommended that horse show entries be sent by certified mail. The show secretary is not responsible for lost or late entries, and is unable to verify receipt of entries due to the volume of mail received. Entries will not be processed without payment.

### Post Entries

For aged events, late entries are accepted, however a penalty fee of \$250 per class, plus all regular class fees will be charged for aged events.

For all other classes, late entries are accepted, however a penalty fee of \$100, plus all regular fees will be charged.

Post entries can be made at the Horse Show Entry Office.

For Limited Age events, post entries must be received by **12:00 Noon on Thursday, October 1.**

For entries for weekend classes, post entries must be received no later than **12:00 Noon the day prior to when the class is to be shown.**

*Regular entry fees will be included in the purses. Penalty payments and cattle charges will not be included in the purse. All fees paid in excess of the regular entry fee will be considered a penalty payment.*

## Refunds

Refunds of entry and stall fee will be given only in the event of death of the horse entered. A signed and dated vet certificate must be presented at the entry office no later than **2:00 p.m. the day before the class entered is to be shown.** Refunds will be mailed after the Congress to the owner.

## Substitutions

A substitution fee of \$100 must accompany the request for substitution. Substitutions must fall within the same class limitations. Changes must be made before posting of draw.

## Identification of Horses

A photocopy of the registration certificate showing current owners, or a notarized statement of age and description by a licensed veterinarian and colored photographs showing all marks of identification or unregistered horses, must be included with all entries.

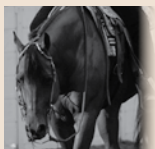
## Arrival

Cutting horses may arrive any time after **8:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 1, 2009.**

## Stalls

Stalls are \$150 each, including show horses, using horses and tack stalls. Every horse, including using horses, must have a stall. All stalls must be in the owner's name. Trainers may pick up stalls if they are paid for in advance.

All horses will be stalled in tents. All exhibitors must report to the stall office to obtain stall permits. All horses, tack and feed stalls must be paid for to obtain stickers. Agents, please have a listing of all horses by the owner's names.



## Registration Papers

All entries must include a copy of registration papers and a copy of all NCHA cards (owner and exhibitor).

## Horse Health Paper Requirements

All required health papers must be presented upon arrival at the Congress. **Do not send health papers in with entries.**

## Ohio Horses

Negative EIA (Coggins) test within the past 12 months is the only paperwork required for Ohio horses. (ORC 901:1-18-08)

## Horses entering Ohio

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 30 days of the opening date of the Congress (October 2, 2009), and if twelve months of age or older, evidence of a negative EIA (Coggins) test within twelve months of the opening date of the Congress (October 2, 2009). The EIA test results shall be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or on an EIA Test form. (ORC901:1-18-08)

If any unforeseen event occurs (i.e. Foreign Animal Disease) other tests and examinations may be required. Documentation review may be required at the gate upon entry.

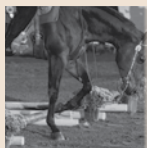

## Rules

### General Rules

- A. Owners may enter more than one horse. Riders may ride more than one horse where NCHA rules permit. Owners and riders must be NCHA members.
- B. A horse must have the same rider in the go-rounds and finals. Any changes in riders can be made with the show manager for dire emergencies only. Changes must be made before posting of draw.
- C. NCHA rules and regulations will prevail in these events unless specific Congress futurity rules differ from them. In this case, Congress rules shall prevail.
- D. Any dispute as to operation of classes, matters of protocol, show management issues and all other issues shall be decided by the show manager.
- E. The show manager's decision shall be final and considered accepted by exhibitors.
- F. The OQHA and the All American Quarter Horse Congress reserve the right to cancel these events without notice and without liability any time prior to the contest. All entry money will be refunded in the event of cancellation.

### Rules for Aged Events

#### Open Futurity, Derby and Classic

\$30,000 added to Open Aged Events

- A. There will be two go-rounds and a clean slate finals.
- B. 60% of the high scoring horses, plus ties, will advance to the second go.
- C. 25% of original entries, plus ties, will advance to finals.
- D. All monies will be paid in finals.
- E. All finalists will receive back their entry fee and cattle charge.
- F. Top Ten will receive the remainder of the purse by NCHA payback.
- G. \$10,000 each will be added to the Open Futurity, Derby and Classic.

#### Non-Pro Futurity, Derby and Classic

\$18,000 added to Non-Pro Aged Events

- A. There will be one go-round and one final.
- B. 35% of the high-scoring horses, plus ties, will advance to the finals.
- C. All monies will be paid in finals.

- D. All finalists will receive back their entry fee and cattle charge.
- E. Top Eight will receive the remainder of the purse by NCHA payback.
- F. \$6,000 each will be added to Non-Pro Futurity, Derby and Classic.

### **Specific Non-Pro Conditions**

- A. Non-pro division riders must be designated at the time of nomination. The definition of a non-pro is as defined by the NCHA rulebook.
- B. Horses exhibited in this division must meet NCHA non-pro ownership requirements.
- C. Any exhibitor in this event questioning the non-pro status of another exhibitor may file an objection in writing with the show manager at least 48 hours before the contest begins. The show manager, before the contest begins, will decide whether to sustain or overrule the objection. The show manager's decision shall be final and considered accepted by all exhibitors.
- D. Any individual who is determined as not meeting the NCHA non-pro status shall forfeit all entry fee and cattle charges.

### **Practice Cattle**

Practice cattle will be available for the Three-Year-Old Congress Futurity entries only on Friday, October 2, at 7:00 p.m. in the Coliseum. Cost will be \$40 per horse. The Congress Cutting events will feature a practice pen in the Overhang. Practice hours will be 6:00 a.m. - ?

### **Draws**

Draws for all aged events, including the Futurity, will be done at 12:00 Noon on Thursday, October 1.

- A. Slots will not be sold.
- B. Entries must include the horse's name.
- C. Substitutions will be allowed within the division for \$100. All substitutions must be made no later than 12:00 Noon on Thursday, October 1, 2009.
- D. Late fees, cattle charges and substitution fees are not included in the purse.

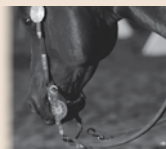
- A. There will be two judges and their combined scores will be used in determining placings.
- B. Three judges will be used for \$25,000 open and non-pro.
- C. Decisions of the judges are final and entries will be accepted only on this condition.

## The Four Sixes come to Congress

NCHA/6666 Ranch World Series of Cutting comes to the All American Quarter Horse Congress for the first time in 2009. \$25,000 will be added to the NCHA Open Cutting and \$25,000 added to the NCHA Non-Pro Cutting. All monies for these events will count toward the 2009 World Champion titles. There will be one go-round and a clean slate final. 25% of entries will advance to the finals. These events will be judged by three judges and payback will be as recommended for the World Series of Cutting events.

## Accommodations

### Camping

**All camping requires a \$70 whole-show pass to be purchased for the towing vehicle or RV. No exceptions.**

### **First-Come, First-Served Camping** – No Reservations

Camping spaces are available at the Ohio Expo Center on a first come, first served basis. Camping fees will be \$40 per day for all first-come, first-served spots. Any camper who experiences electrical problems should contact the Congress Stall Office at (614) 294-0150.

All horse trailers parking South of 17th Avenue will be charged the \$40 per day camping fee. Trailers that are not being used for camping will have the option to park at no charge in the trailer lot North of 17th Avenue.

The state requires that you pay for the entire show length up front (beginning the day you set up your campsite). Campers not staying the entire show may collect a refund check at the Camping Refund Office, 8:00a.m. – 5:00p.m., Monday-Friday or 10:00a.m. – 5:00p.m., Saturday and Sunday. To receive a refund, a dated Ohio Expo Center camper pass must be presented. Those staying past 12:00 noon will be charged for an additional day. If leaving after Refund Office hours, refunds may be obtained from the Congress Stall Office.

### **Reserved VIP Camping**

The Congress will offer a limited number of reserved VIP camping spots at the 2009 Congress. The reserved camping lot will be a fenced area located adjacent to the Scottsdale Arena. The area will be limited to 40 campers.

In exchange for a \$3,000 fee, VIP campers will receive a mailed camping pass for the duration of the Congress, a fenced area with a reserved spot, electric and water hook-up, monitored security and a complimentary two-person golf cart. There will be limited sewage hookups available, and septic cleaning service will also be

available. The VIP camper can upgrade the two-person golf cart at their own expense through Salopek. Camping spaces will be large enough for an awning or cart next to the camper.

Spaces will be assigned in the order reserved upon receipt of a signed contract and 50% deposit.

## Camping Policies

All camping is at the discretion of the Ohio Expo Center and the Ohio Exposition Commission; prices and policies are subject to change.
