

2011 NCHA 5/6-Year-Old Classic/Challenge

Presented by Great American Insurance



I. 2011 Nominations

1. To be held in July of 2011.
2. For five- and six-year-olds (foals of 2005 and 2006), all breeds.
3. The 2011 NCHA Classic/Challenge will be held in two divisions: Open and Non-Professional. Entry in the Open Classic/Challenge shall be made by horse. A horse may be entered in both divisions. Note: Owners may enter an unlimited number of horses in the Open Division.

5. **Late Entries:** Late entries will be allowed by paying **50 percent** as much as is due on original entries, plus remaining fees. Late entries will be allowed after the draw but before the beginning of the first scheduled go-round by paying two times the nomination fee (\$4,000.00).

- a. Any payment received in the NCHA office postmarked after the date due will be subject to a penalty according to the late penalty schedule. **There will be a 10-day grace period.**

- b. All late entries must be made prior to the beginning of the first scheduled go-round. Late entries made after the draw will be required to work last in a herd of cattle.

II. Rules Applicable to Non-Pro Entries

1. A Non-Pro has two options on entering the Classic/Challenge in the Non-Pro division.
 - a. You may name your horse when you send in the first payment.
 - b. You may enter under your name (slot).
2. Non-Professional riders may purchase only the number of "slots" for horses which they are eligible to ride—limited to two of each age and any sex.
3. **A Non-Professional rider's name (slot) may be sold to another Non-Professional.**

- a. A non-pro may sell their slot or named entry after the draw but before the beginning of the first scheduled go-round. The buyer will be required to submit horse registration papers or a bill of sale showing proof of ownership to the NCHA along with \$500. (\$250 jackpot, \$250 office charge). When a Non-Professional or Amateur sells a slot after the draw they cannot repurchase another slot in that class. They may however buy a horse from another Non-Professional or Amateur which is entered in that class and show the purchased horse in the slot which has been assigned to that horse.

4. If, at the time final nomination payment is made, the horse or horses to be ridden are not named, you have the option to withhold this information until 24 hours prior to the event for an additional charge equal to the applicable substitution fee (\$500.00).

5. Each Non-Professional Classic/Challenge entry shall name the horse or horses to be ridden. If a Non-Professional rider doesn't name his/her horse or horses before the draw, the working order will be drawn in the name of the rider; if two horses are entered they shall work in alphabetical order. A rider who names one horse will work in the first assigned draw and the other draw will be left vacant.

6. Double Entry and Transfer Privileges Entry made in a Non-Professional rider's name (slot) may not be transferred to the Open division.

- a. Any horse paid up to date in either division on or before the April 15 payment may enter in the other division without a late penalty. If you have a Non-Pro slot, you must name your horse at this time.

- b. A Non-Pro can transfer to the Open division if the horse is named on the first payment entry form.

- c. A horse (not a slot) may be transferred to or from either division on or before April 15 without penalty, and may be transferred until the final payment by payment of a \$100.00 transfer fee. A transfer after the final payment but before the draw will be required to pay \$1000 plus a \$100 transfer fee.

7. A Non-Professional must send in proof of ownership of horse as required by NCHA standing rules with accompanying entry.

Each competitor agrees to submit to and cooperate in providing a polygraph test regarding compliance with proof of horse ownership as required by NCHA rules. The contestant will be available on the day following the Finals to permit such testing if requested. The administration and interpretation of any polygraph test shall be solely the responsibility of the NCHA through the Executive Director who, without limiting the foregoing, shall have sole discretion to select the place where the test is administered, the individual who administers the test and the questions to be used in the test.

III. Classic/Challenge rules applicable to all entries

1. Double Entry and Transfer Privileges

- a. Any horse paid up to date in either division on or before the April 15 payment is due may enter in the other division without a late penalty.

- b. A Non-Pro can transfer to the Open division if you named your horse on the entry form when making your first payment.

- c. A horse (**not a slot**) may be transferred to or from either division on or before April 15 without penalty, and may be transferred until the final payment by payment of a \$100.00 transfer fee. Transfer after the final payment is due but before



the draw will be required to pay \$1000 plus a \$100 transfer fee.

2. **Substitutions:** *NON-PRO Division: The owner will be allowed to substitute another horse by paying one-half (1/2) again as much as has been paid on original entry with a maximum of \$500. No substitution will be allowed after the beginning of the division's first go-round. OPEN Division: If a veterinary certificate is received stating that a horse entered will be unable to work, the owner will be allowed to substitute another horse by paying one-half (1/2) again as much as has been paid on original entry. No substitution will be allowed after the beginning of the division's first go-round. A horse that has been substituted in the open will be unable to be shown in any other division for the remainder of the show. No substitution will be allowed after the beginning of a division's first go-round. After the draw any horse that is in the Open Division may sell their draw position if a veterinary certificate is received stating that the horse entered is unable to compete. The buyer of that draw position will be required to pay NCHA an additional \$2000. (\$1,750 jackpot, \$250 office charge). Horse registration papers must be submitted to NCHA for the new entry. This transaction must be completed before the beginning of the divisions' first go-round to be able to compete. A horse that has had their draw position sold will be unable to be shown in any other division for the remainder of the show.*
3. **Change of Ownership:** An entry may change ownership and retain eligibility under the new owner, provided the National Cutting Horse Association Limited Age Events Committee is so advised and the new owner keeps up all payments when due.
4. **Declining Entries:** Entries to this contest are received subject to the right of the National Cutting Horse Association Limited Age Events Committee to refuse the entry or acceptance of a transfer of any entry without notice to the subscriber. The decisions of the Committee shall be final in all matters. The National Cutting Horse Association reserves the right to cancel this event without notice at any time prior to the contest without liability to them, but in such event, return all entry money to subscribers.
5. **Open and Non-Professional division riders will be allowed to show four horses of any age combination. Any violation of this rule will cause the rider to be disqualified from the contest on all horses with possible additional disciplinary action.**
6. All owners and riders of a nominated horse must be members in good standing of the National Cutting Horse Association.
7. **Refunds:** There will be no refunds for any reason.
8. **Failure to Pay Fees:** All entry fees will be made payable to the National Cutting Horse Association in United States Funds or its equivalent and transmitted by U.S. Mail showing stamp cancellation date not later than midnight of the due date. All fees must be paid on or before dates specified or entry will be cancelled without refund. **There will be a 10-day grace period.**
 - a. **The draw** will not take place more than twenty-one (21) days prior to the beginning of the first scheduled go-round. Only those horses (or Non-Professional riders) for which all payments have been **received** in the NCHA office will be drawn. **There will be no exceptions.** In the event that a horse properly entered is left out of the draw, a redraw **will not** be held. In order to establish a working order for this entry, the judge will draw one number based on the original draw numbers and insert the entry in the position drawn. The entry shall work behind the number drawn.
9. **Identification of Horses:** A photocopy of the registration certificate of registered horses, or a notarized statement of age and description by a licensed veterinarian for unregistered horses, must be forwarded to the NCHA business office no later than April 15, 2011. Horses entered late after said date must furnish this identification with entry. (Identification filed for NCHA Futurity or Super Stakes will be automatically transferred.) A horse is not eligible to participate in the National Cutting Horse Derby if its age as determined by examination of

its teeth does not correspond to the age shown on its registration certificate on registered horses or the notarized statement of age and description required for unregistered horses, such determination by dentition examination to be made in accordance with The Official Guide for Determining the Age of the Horse as currently published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners.

10. **Change of Ownership:** An entry may change ownership and retain eligibility under the new owner, provided the appropriate National Cutting Horse Association Committee is so advised and the new owner keeps up all payments when due.
11. **Declining Entries:** Entries to this contest are received subject to the right of the appropriate National Cutting Horse Association Committee to refuse the entry or the acceptance of a transfer of any entry without notice to the subscriber. The decisions of the Committee shall be final in all matters. The National Cutting Horse Association reserves the right to cancel this event without notice at any time prior to the contest without liability to them, but in such event, return all entrance money to subscribers.
12. **Classic/Challenge Trials (Both Divisions):** All horses entered will work in the Classic/Challenge trials to be held before the actual Classic/Challenge provided they meet all previous stated requirements. The trials shall consist of two go-rounds; conditioned, however, that at the conclusion of the first go-round only the high scoring sixty percent (60%) with a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) of the horses in each division will advance to the second trials go-round and that all other horses will be dropped from further competition. The number of horses to advance to the finals shall be equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of those horses competing in the second go-round with a minimum of ten (10) and a maximum of twenty-five (25). The top 20 horses plus ties will come from the first and second go-rounds combined scores. If there are less than 25, the remainder of the available slots will be filled by a one-bunch wildcard go-round which will be made up of the next qualifying scores. This wildcard bunch will not exceed 20 total horses plus ties, and will consist of only one set. The wildcard round will not be necessary if a 25-horse finals is reached from the first two go-rounds. The top twenty-five (25) will receive checks, and entries twenty-six (26) through forty (40) will receive \$4,000.00. There will not be a wild card round in the Non-Professional division. Fourteen percent (14%) of entered horses with a maximum of 25 plus ties to the finals. Twenty-five percent (25%) with a maximum of forty (40) horses plus ties will receive a premium check.
13. **Classic/Challenge (Both Divisions):** The remaining original nomination fees and the appropriate percentage of the added money will make up the purse for the Classic/Challenge in each division. Premium money will be paid to all finalists. Only the score in the Classic/Challenge will be considered to determine placings. In the event of a tie for the Championship in any division, there will be co-champions. If two tie, first and second place premiums will be added together, and split 50 percent and 50 percent equally. If more than two tie, all premiums will be split equally, and there will be a work-off for prizes and the title.
14. **Late Entries:** Late entries will be allowed by paying a fifty percent (50%) penalty on original sustaining fees plus remaining fees.
 - a. Late entries will be accepted after the draw. For entries that were current until the last sustaining payment, the penalty shall be fifty percent (50%) of the final sustaining fee. The penalty shall be two times the total entry fee if the entry is not current in sustaining payments. All late entries must be made prior to the beginning of the first scheduled go round of the Summer Cutting Spectacular. Late entries made after the draw will be required to work last in a herd of cattle.
15. **Judges:** Five judges will be named to judge the event from those eligible judges on the NCHA Approved Judges List who have indicated their probable availability. All judges will be

under the direct supervision of the NCHA Director of Judges.

16. Judging:

- a. Each judge will score every horse and the highest and lowest scores for each horse will be discarded. The total of the remaining three scores will be the horse's official mark.
- b. No individual scores will be announced; however, unidentifiable photo copies of all judges' cards will be posted.
- c. All score cards will be retained for three years and will then be destroyed.
- d. Anyone making remarks referring to the score or scores given any horse to a judge, a Judge Monitor or to his or her companion or family will be given an immediate hearing by the appropriate committee and, if deemed guilty, will be disqualified, forfeit any money won and banned from the arena.
- e. The NCHA Adjusted Monitor System, and all rules and polices set forth by that system will be used.

17. All rules of the National Cutting Horse Association not in direct conflict with the rules of the National Cutting Horse Classic/Challenge, as published herein, or amended in accordance with Derby Rule #20 shall apply.

18. These rules subject to change by action of the Executive Committee only.

19. A competing rider will be given one (1) minute to ride to the herd after name is called, or clock will start automatically. If the cutter has helped the previous cutter, the time allotted will be two (2) minutes
